1. What to Report

Reports may include:

- Fake RTBL certificates or badge misuse
- Expired, suspended, or altered certificates
- Impersonation or fraudulent broadcaster profiles
- Rights complaints involving RTBL members
- Misleading claims that RTBL is a government licence
- Security or abuse involving RTBL systems

2. Where to Send Reports

Abuse reports should be sent to abuse@rtbl.com. Legal notices may be sent to legal@rtbl.org. Include evidence, URLs, screenshots, dates, and your contact details.

3. Review Process

RTBL may acknowledge, classify, request more information, contact the member, temporarily hide a listing, suspend a badge, or close the report if insufficient information is provided.

4. Emergency and Legal Matters

RTBL is not an emergency service. If there is immediate danger or illegal conduct, reporters should contact the relevant platform, host, rights holder, or authority directly.

5. Outcomes

Possible outcomes include no action, correction request, warning, profile edit, temporary suspension, certificate revocation, termination, or referral to appropriate parties.

This policy defines conduct that is prohibited for RTBL applicants, members, website users, and badge holders.

1. Prohibited Misrepresentation

Members must not:

- Describe RTBL as a government authority
- Claim RTBL approval means legal authorization to broadcast
- Hide expired or revoked status
- Alter certificate text, QR links, or expiry dates
- Use the badge for unapproved stations or channels

2. Prohibited Content and Activity

RTBL may refuse or suspend services related to:

- Content that violates applicable law
- Unauthorized music, film, sports, or copyrighted material
- Fraud, phishing, scams, impersonation, or deceptive fundraising
- Harassment, threats, exploitation, or abuse
- Malware, hacking, credential theft, or platform attacks
- Illegal surveillance, privacy violations, or doxxing

3. Platform Abuse

Users may not scrape, overload, attack, reverse engineer, bypass access controls, or interfere with RTBL website, registry, API, verification pages, or certificate systems.

4. Enforcement

RTBL may remove content, suspend records, revoke certificates, block access, report abuse, or preserve evidence when it believes this policy was violated.

This agreement is for applicants and members seeking registration, verification, certification, certificate renewal, or RTBL badge usage.

1. Parties

This agreement is between RTBL and the applicant or member identified in the applicable application, order form, or renewal record.

2. Registration Scope

RTBL registration covers the specific broadcaster, station, channel, network, app, stream, website, or platform profile approved by RTBL. It does not automatically cover affiliates, clones, partner channels, additional websites, or transferred ownership unless approved.

3. Applicant Obligations

Applicant must:

- Submit accurate information
- Maintain valid contact email and website information
- Disclose material changes in ownership, category, content, country/region, or stream URLs
- Maintain policies appropriate for its content and audience
- Respond to RTBL inquiries and complaints in a reasonable time
- Renew annually to keep status active

4. Rights and Content Declaration

Applicant confirms it owns or has appropriate permissions for station name, trademarks, logos, content, music, recordings, sports footage, archival material, subscriptions, advertising, and any

content it distributes.

5. Local Licensing

Applicant accepts that RTBL is not a government authorization and applicant is solely responsible for local broadcast, media, telecom, spectrum, business, tax, consumer, advertising, privacy, and copyright compliance.

6. Review Rights

RTBL may request documents, screenshots, website access, test stream links, policies, or explanations to evaluate a registry application or complaint. RTBL may deny approval without obligation to accept every applicant.

7. Expiration and Revocation

Registration expires at the end of the paid term or earlier if revoked. Upon expiration, suspension, or revocation, applicant must stop using RTBL badges, certificates, and claims of active status.

8. Indemnity

Applicant agrees to defend and hold RTBL harmless from claims arising from applicant content, operations, rights disputes, false statements, regulator issues, or misuse of RTBL status.

1. Permitted Use

Active members may:

- Display the exact badge level approved by RTBL
- Link the badge to the public RTBL verification page
- Use the certificate in proposals, websites, media kits, and app listings
- State that they are listed in the RTBL private digital registry

2. Required Context

When practical, members should include: "RTBL is a private digital registry and certificate, not a government broadcast licence."

3. Prohibited Use

Members must not:

- Edit certificate dates, ID numbers, status, or language
- Display a badge after expiry, suspension, or revocation
- Use RTBL marks for unapproved channels or sister companies
- Register confusingly similar domains or social handles
- Use RTBL marks in a way that suggests government authority

4. Brand Control

RTBL may publish badge artwork and brand guidelines. Members must use current artwork and stop using outdated or revoked badges on request.

5. Revocation

Badge rights end immediately on expiry, nonpayment, suspension, termination, or written notice from RTBL.

3. Audience Protection

Members should use reasonable content ratings, warnings, moderation, privacy practices, and child safety measures appropriate to their content and audience.

4. Complaint Handling

Members should provide a working contact email, review complaints in good faith, remove or correct unlawful or unauthorized content when appropriate, and cooperate with RTBL review.

5. Renewal Integrity

Members must not continue using expired certificates, edited certificate images, old badges, or misleading screenshots after termination.

1. Scope

RTBL does not host member broadcast streams unless separately agreed. RTBL may host registry profiles, logos, descriptions, certificates, and verification pages. Content complaints about actual broadcasts may need to be sent to the member, host, platform, CDN, app store, payment provider, or rights authority.

2. Notice Requirements

A notice should include:

- Rights owner name and contact
- Description of copyrighted or protected material
- URL or evidence of the allegedly infringing use
- Statement of good-faith belief
- Statement that the information is accurate
- Authority of the sender to act
- Signature or typed name

3. RTBL Action

RTBL may remove or hide materials from the registry, forward notices to members, request counter-information, suspend badge status, or require proof of rights as a condition of continued membership.

4. False Notices

Submitting false or abusive notices may expose the sender to liability. RTBL may reject incomplete, abusive, or unrelated notices.

2. Processing Details

Subject matter may include:

- Applications and renewals

- Support, complaints, and abuse review
- Payment and invoice records
- Website security and analytics

3. Security Measures

RTBL should maintain:

- Access controls
- Encryption in transit
- Limited staff access
- Backups and audit logs where appropriate
- Vendor review for hosting, payment, email, and analytics

4. Subprocessors

RTBL may use hosting, payment, email, analytics, customer support, security, and document providers. The operator should list production subprocessors before launch.

5. International Transfers

The RTBL operator should add applicable transfer mechanisms, data residency commitments, and regional privacy terms before launch.

2. Neutrality

RTBL does not claim authority from any single country or government. It may accept members from many regions, subject to RTBL policies, sanctions, payment availability, risk review, and applicable law.

3. Transparency

RTBL should make clear on certificates, badges, website pages, and terms that it is private and does not replace local official approvals.

4. Safety and Rights

RTBL should maintain complaint, abuse, and rights-review channels to protect the integrity of the registry and reduce misuse.

5. Future Development

RTBL may add APIs, third-party verification partners, country guidance pages, education programs, technical audits, and multi-station network tools.

Applicants must operate or plan to operate a radio, TV, OTT, streaming, podcast, or broadcast-related media service and must provide accurate ownership and contact details.

3. Review and Approval

RTBL may approve, reject, request more information, or condition approval on corrections. Approval criteria may evolve to protect the registry.

4. Annual Review

RTBL may require renewal declarations, updated contact details, active links, rights declarations, payment confirmation, and policy review before extending status.

5. Suspension

RTBL may suspend a profile during investigation of complaints, rights issues, fraud, misuse, nonpayment, or legal risk.

6. Appeals

A member may request reconsideration by emailing legal@rtbl.org with evidence. RTBL may accept, reject, or modify the appeal outcome at its discretion.

This Privacy Policy explains how RTBL may collect, use, publish, and protect information submitted by applicants, members, website visitors, complainants, and verification users.

1. Information We Collect

RTBL may collect:

- Applicant name, company, role, email, phone, address, and identity or business documents where required
- Station/channel name, logo, website, stream URLs, app links, social links, content categories, and country/region declarations
- Payment and invoice information processed by payment providers
- Compliance declarations, support messages, complaints, takedown requests, and abuse reports
- Website logs, IP address, device information, cookies, and analytics data

2. How We Use Information

RTBL uses information to:

- Process applications and renewals
- Verify identity, domain, contact, and technical readiness
- Publish public registry profiles and verification pages
- Provide certificates, badges, documents, and support
- Detect fraud, misuse, infringement, abuse, and security risks
- Comply with legal requests and protect RTBL rights

3. Public Registry Data

Approved members understand that selected information may be public, including RTBL-ID, station name, status, category, website, declared country/region, issue date, expiry date, and verification status. Private personal information should not be published unless necessary or authorized.

4. Sharing

RTBL may share information with service providers, payment processors, hosting providers, verification partners, legal advisors, safety reviewers, rights holders when appropriate, or authorities where legally required.

5. International Processing

RTBL is international. Data may be processed in countries different from the applicant or visitor. The RTBL operator should add its data transfer mechanism and privacy compliance details before launch.

6. Retention

RTBL retains member records while the account is active and as needed for renewals, disputes, audit, fraud prevention, legal obligations, and legitimate business records.

7. Rights and Requests

Depending on applicable law, users may request access, correction, deletion, restriction, or portability of personal data. Requests may be sent to legal@rtbl.org. RTBL may need to verify identity before acting.

8. Security

3. Member Responsibility

Members must check official regulators, lawyers, music rights organizations, sports rights holders, content owners, payment processors, app stores, and advertising rules applicable to their service. RTBL may provide educational checklists but does not make legal determinations.

4. Required Website Wording

Members displaying an RTBL badge should include wording substantially similar to: "RTBL is a private digital registry. This badge is not a government broadcast licence."

5. Enforcement

This policy explains annual fees, renewals, expiry, refund rules, and status changes.

1. Annual Membership

RTBL registration, verification, certification, and badge licences are annual unless a written order form says otherwise. Certificates show an issue date and expiry date.

2. Renewal

Members should renew before expiry to avoid loss of active status. RTBL may send reminders but is not responsible if reminders are blocked or missed.

3. Refunds

Because RTBL provides digital review, registry setup, certificate generation, and profile publication, fees are generally non-refundable after work starts. RTBL may offer discretionary refunds before review begins, duplicate payments, billing mistakes, or where required by applicable law.

4. Rejection

If RTBL rejects an application before issuing any certificate or public profile, RTBL may refund the fee minus payment processing, review, or administrative costs if disclosed in the order form.

5. Suspension or Revocation

No refund is owed when suspension or revocation results from false information, badge misuse, rights complaints, abuse, chargeback, or policy violations.

6. Price Changes

2. RTBL Services

RTBL may provide:

- Digital broadcaster registration
- RTBL-ID and public verification page
- Digital certificate and QR code
- Badge licence according to membership level
- Compliance templates, checklists, and educational materials
- Optional technical verification or enhanced review

3. No Official Broadcast Authorization

RTBL is a private international digital registry and certification platform.
